SHOW RULES

1. Eligibility of Animals: All goats must be registered in the herd book of a recognized association. Recognized associations include: American Boer Goat Association, International Boer Goat Association, and Canadian Boer Goat Association.
2. Original registration certificates are required, except that a copy of a registration application, stamped with the date received by one of the listed associations, can be accepted for kids less than 3 months of age. Animals over the age of 3 months must have the original registration certificate in hand at time of show.
3. All goats must be appropriately identified and comply with USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Guidelines. Call 1-888-USDA TAG (873-2824) or visit the following website for more information: http://www.aphis.usda.gov/animal_health/animal_diseases/scrapie/
4. Entries: This show is open to all registered Boer goats that meet the requirements of Rule 1400, section A(i). Show Representatives may use their discretion and have the right to ban an individual if they consider it necessary for the good of the show.
5. Ennobled Herd Book Points: Only goats entered under their ABGA registration number and presenting their ABGA Certificate of Registration will be eligible to earn points for their actual placing in the show as described in the ABGA Criteria for Ennoblement of a Boer Goat.

6. Tattoos: All goats must have legible tattoos consistent with the registration certificate or the animal will be disqualified. If an animal is disqualified due to illegible or inconsistent tattoos, all lower placing animals will be moved up in placement. Point winners from each class must have their tattoos read and recorded.
7. Computing Ages: Birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate, will be used in determining class divisions. In order to calculate the class breaks, take the show date and count back to the birth date to determine the age and the class for the animal.
8. Classes: All animals must be registered Purebred, Fullblood , or percentage blood Boer goats. Bucks 96.86% and lower are not eligible to be shown. Progeny of fresh does will not be allowed in the ring with their dam. At the discretion of the judge and the superintendent, the animals may be let loose in the ring as a function of judging. The Champion and the Reserve Champion classes will be chosen from the first and second place animals in that division of the show. Divisions will be defined as follows: Percentage Does 50 to 88%, Fullblood/Purebred Does 93.75% and higher and Fullblood/Purebred Bucks 96.87% and higher.
9. Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration document. Persons showing animals whose registration certificates have signed transfers that have not been processed by the registering association office must show those animals as agent for the owner on the registration certificate. **YOUTH NOTE: All animals must be owned and exhibited by the exhibitor. Animals must be registered in the name of the participant only. The only exceptions for exhibiting shall be 1) if the exhibitor has more than one animal showing at that time or 2) if the member is in attendance, but physically unable to show his/her goat. If the member is physically unable to show his/her animal, he/she must present a doctor's statement to show management.**
10. Health papers are required.
11. Any animal with any contagious diseases including, but not limited to, pink eye, sore mouth, ringworm, or abscesses in any stage will not be admitted. In the case of a dispute, a veterinarian will be called at the owner's expense. Animals refused for health reasons are required to stay in their vehicle and will not be shown. Please be considerate of the animals of other exhibitors by not bringing those goats that may be refused entry for health reasons.
12. DOGS MUST BE CONTAINED. THIS WILL BE ENFORCED.
13. The American Boer Goat Association, The Missouri State Fairgrounds, Missouri Junior Boer Goat Association, or Advisors for the Missouri Junior Boer Goat, will not be held responsible for illness, injury, damage or loss of animals, person or property.
14. Substitutions will be allowed within the same class, limited to 5 each exhibitor.
15. NO REFUNDS WILL BE MADE.
16. YOU MAY SEND IN YOUR ENTRY FORM WITHOUT REGISTRATION NUMBERS IF YOU ARE WAITING ON REGISTRATION PAPERS...BUT ALL OTHER INFORMATION MUST BE COMPLETED.
